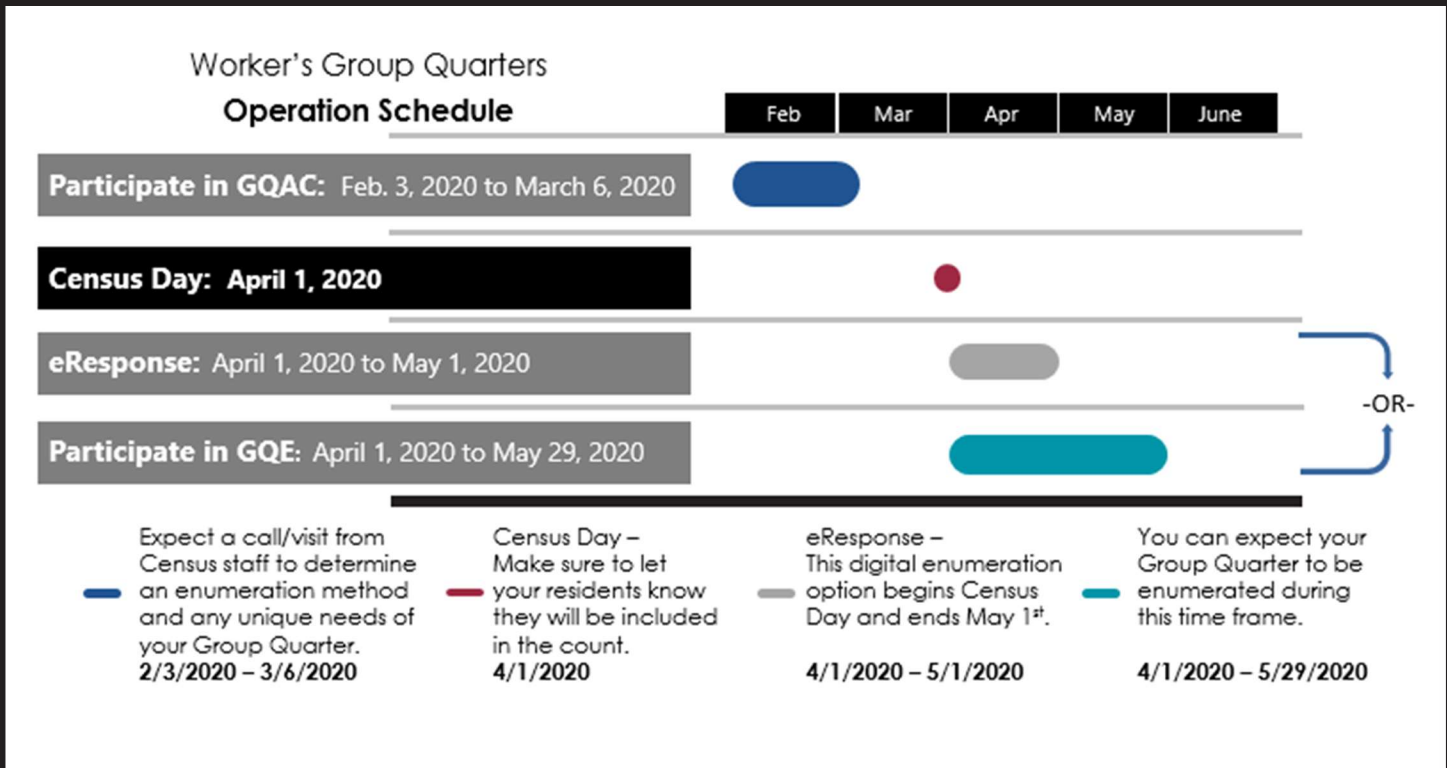


Worker's Group Living Quarters

2. HOW will my facility be counted?

Definition:

- Worker's Group Living Quarters include facilities such as dormitories, bunkhouses, and similar types of group living arrangements for agricultural and non-agricultural workers. Examples include migratory farm worker camps, construction worker camps, Job Corps centers, federal/state law enforcement academies, fire academies, and vocational training facilities.
- This category also includes facilities that provide a full-time, year-round residential program offering a vocational training and employment program that helps young people 16-to-24 years old learn a trade, earn a high school diploma or GED and get help finding a job.

Residency Criteria:

- Live-in employees are **counted where they live and sleep most of the time.**
- People in Worker's Quarters are **counted where they live and sleep most of the time.** Residents and staff who do not have a usual home elsewhere are counted at the facility.

- Drop Off/Pick Up
- eResponse (Electronic Response Data Transfer)
- In-Person Interview
- Paper Response Data Collection (Paper Listings)
